Sir Kenneth Keith is Distinguished Fellow of the Faculty of Law at Victoria University of Wellington. Sir Kenneth was elected a judge of the International Court of Justice in 2005. He was earlier a judge of the New Zealand Court of Appeal and Supreme Court and a judge of appeal in Samoa, the Cook Islands, Niue and Fiji. He was also a member of arbitration tribunals; a law commissioner in New Zealand; a law faculty member at Victoria University of Wellington; and a member of the legal offices of the United Nations and the New Zealand Ministry of Foreign Affairs.

Sir Kenneth will discuss the Treaty of Waitangi in the context of international law with reference to his experiences dealing with comparable international agreements as a judge of the International Court of Justice.
