Paul Beverley – Recent developments in co-governance and co-management

Paul Beverley will talk about recent developments in the co-governance and co-management of natural resources. Paul has been involved in the development of innovative approaches to natural resource governance, including arrangements for the governance of Te Urewera and the Whanganui River.

Paul is a partner at Buddle Findlay where he leads the resource management and Māori law team. He graduated with a BCom and LLB from Otago University and an LLM (Hons) from Victoria University. Paul specialises in resource management, Māori and Treaty settlement law and negotiations and conservation law. He has acted for the Crown in over 40 Treaty settlements, with a primary focus on the design and negotiation of natural resource frameworks (including in relation to co-governance and co-management). He also advises widely on the Marine and Coastal Area (Takutai Moana) Act 2011.
