**Horiana Irwin-Easthope** (Ngāti Porou, Ngāti Kahungunu, Rakaipaaka) is a solicitor at Kahui Legal. She completed an LLB and a BA at Victoria University and in May 2014 she graduated with her LLM (Masters of Law) from Harvard University. Prior to starting at Kahui Legal, Horiana worked in a large national law firm in their Māori Legal, Resource Management and Commercial Litigation Teams. Her experience includes working on whanau development projects and legal mechanisms for the protection of matauranga Maori; working with hapu and iwi collectives primarily in the context of environmental and commercial negotiations.

**Natalie Coates** (Ngāti Awa, Ngāti Hine, Ngāti Tūwharetoa (ki Kawerau), Tūhourangi, Tūhoe) is also a solicitor at Kahui Legal. Natalie holds honours degrees in Law and Arts (Māori Studies) from the University of Otago. In 2011 Natalie received the Fulbright Ngā Pae o te Māramatanga graduate award, the New Zealand Law Foundation Ethel Benjamin Scholarship and a Ngārimu VC and 28th (Maori) Battalion Memorial Masters Scholarship. These awards allowed Natalie to obtain a LLM (Masters of Law) from Harvard University. Prior to joining Kahui Legal Natalie worked for an iwi organisation, two of New Zealand's large national law firms, an international human rights organisation and the Auckland University Faculty of Law.
