Paul Beverley is a partner at Buddle Findlay where he leads the resource management and Māori law team. He graduated with a BCom and LLB from Otago University and an LLM (Hons) from Victoria University. Paul specialises in resource management, Māori and Treaty settlement law and negotiations and conservation law. He has acted for the Crown on over 40 Treaty settlements, with a primary focus on the design and negotiation of natural resource frameworks (including in relation to co-governance and co-management). For example, Paul was a member of the core design and negotiation teams in relation to the Whanganui River; Tuhoe (Te Urewera); Tupuna Maunga Authority arrangements in Tamaki Makaurau; the Waikato River, Rangitaiki River and Kaituna River, and arrangements in Te Tau Ihu, Hauraki, Taranaki and Te Hiku (including over Te Oneroa a Tohe). He also advises widely on the Marine and Coastal Area (Takutai Moana) Act.
