Professor Tony Angelo, Faculty of Law, VUW

Professor Tony Angelo is one of New Zealand's foremost comparative law scholars.

He has a special interest in small states law and has been Special Advisor, Attorney-General's Chambers, Mauritius for various periods between 1970 -2000, and constitutional advisor to the Government of Tokelau, and to the Government of Niue.

He has been widely recognised for his work in the Pacific and has been honoured by the French government for his long involvement with the Université de la Polynésie Française.

He has published extensively on the laws of Mauritius, Seychelles and the small nations of the Pacific. His current projects involve work for a number of Pacific states as well as work in Seychelles relating to access to law (production of law reports) and research for the revision of the Civil Code.
